Call to Order

- Penny Sheppard called the meeting to order at 6:00pm
- Penny Sheppard presented the minutes from the meeting and asked for changes or corrections.
 - No corrections to be made, minutes are accepted as written.

Reports and Presentations

- Director's Report
 - *Presented by Richard Campbell*
 - Visitation
 - CHM site-wide visitation for the month of May totaled five thousand, two hundred and ninety-seven. The year-to-date total is at sixty-seven thousand and ninety-two visitors.
 - School Groups
 - For the month of May, school group visitation totaled one thousand, five hundred and fifty-two. Year-to-date school visitation is at twelve thousand and sixty-nine.
 - Membership
 - Membership has increased by ninety-two memberships with a total revenue of \$6,965. This brings our total year-to-date memberships to one thousand, two hundred and thirty-five with a revenue of \$92,560. The CHM overall memberships are at one thousand, three hundred and eighty-four.
 - Past Events
 - Fascinating Forests Family Day

- This event took place at the Museum of York County on June 1st, kicking off our summer programming of forest, snails, and fungi. One hundred eighty-three visitors were in attendance.
- York School District 1 Summer Enrichment Program Partnership
 - From June 10th- 13th, the Museum of York County hosted twenty-three children for a grant-funded program aimed at improving their reading scores through fun learning.
- DIY With Dad
 - On June 15th, the Main Street Children’s Museum hosted “DIY With Dad”, where dads and their children collaborated by building birdhouses out of Popsicle sticks. There were forty-eight in attendance, selling out the event.
- Living History Saturday: A Celebration of the Senses
 - This month-long event took place on Saturdays at Historic Brattonsville and highlighted the craftsmanship of African-descended individuals from the Brattonsville community as well as the broader Carolina Piedmont and focused on the visual, olfactory, and auditory experience. Ninety-eight visitors were in attendance for the first two weekends in June.
- Living History Saturday: Juneteenth
 - This event took place at Historic Brattonsville on June 15th and commemorated the abolition of slavery and its relevance to the community. Visitors were engaged in various hands-on activities from making recipe booklets to viewing Juneteenth artifacts. Sixty-two visitors were in attendance.
- Upcoming Events
 - Messy Maestros
 - This annual summer art program will take place each Thursday from June through August. Each week, participants will create projects aligned with the monthly theme. In the first two weeks, the program saw seventy-five attendees.
 - Hill’s Ironworks Historical Marker
 - The original, damaged, historical marker of Hill’s Ironworks has been replaced with a new one and a rededication of the marker will take place at Allison Creek Park on July 12th at 2pm. This event honors the anniversary of the Ironwork’s destruction by the British on June 16, 1780.
 - Battle of Huck’s Defeat
 - The annual reenactment of the Battle of Huck’s Defeat will be taking place on July 13th and 14th at Historic Brattonsville. In addition to the battle reenactment, activities will include live cavalry and musket firing

demonstrations, children's militia drills, games, and education. There will also be tours of the Bratton homes and battlefield. Carin Bloom from Middleton Place will also be giving a special presentation titled ""A Black Loyalist's Liberty: How Lucy Banbury Took Back Her Freedom"" at noon both days.

- World Snake Day

- This event will take place at the Museum of York County on July 20th. It will celebrate snakes! Attendees will have the opportunity to learn about their fascinating qualities and the importance of their conservation, while participating in fun filled, snake-themed activities.

- Fish with Teeth Camp

- The Museum of York County will be hosting a week-long camp at the end of the July, focusing on deep sea creatures with various activities, games, and crafts.

- Wake Up Sleepyhead

- On July 27th, the Main Street Children's Museum will celebrate National Sleepyhead Day. By reading bedtime stories, counting sheep, and learning lullabies, it will create a cozy environment for all attendees.

- CHM Project Updates

- Ice Age Hall

- On June 24th, Enpuricon Inc. is scheduled to commence mold remediation work in the Ice Age Hall, work should take one week. Drywall installation and mural reinstallation will follow.

- Colonel Bratton Preservation Project

- Midwest Maintenance has requested a thirty day extension, focusing on gutter and downspout installations. Preservation has completed their project on the interior skim coat and found damage to the logs underneath. A consultation with Matteo Ferran Structural Engineers has been scheduled.

- Homestead House Preservation Project

- Midwest Maintenance has requested a thirty day extension on the Homestead as well to focus on roofing panels and gutter installation.

- Fluid Preservation Room

- Catalyst Construction has obtained the building permit form the City of Rock Hill and will begin the project within the week. Coordination with the Ice Age Hall repairs will be essential.

- Lowry Family Theatre Repair Project

- Midwest Maintenance submitted hard copies of drawings for permit review to the City of York in April, however the City had not initiated the review process. Subsequently, digital copies have been submitted to the City. During a visit from the deputy fire chief, MMI was advised that an

alternative fire protection measure is necessary while the sprinklers are disabled. Since then, MMI has taken measures to meet the required fire rating.

- Watt Cemetery
 - In early June, John Fisher, formerly of SCIAA, marked the graves in Grid One, assisted by Bratton descendant Nancy Holmes. Initial mapping has been completed and anomalies have been identified in Grid Seven. Though some issues came up, John Fisher will be back to perform more detailed GPR scans. The final report is scheduled for submission by October 31st.
 - All cameras have been installed, as has the perimeter fencing. Exhibits has fabricated four hundred and thirty-five steel markers, more material has been ordered based on a final number count. We are awaiting confirmation regarding road installation so we may move forward with the parking lot.
- Shake Roof Replacement for Work Barn, Original Outbuilding, & Original Smoke House
 - The shakes are currently being manufactured with installation scheduled following Huck's Defeat. The project has been contracted by Benton Roofing.
- Jefferson High School Historical Marker Update
 - Zach Lemhouse and Nancy Sambets presented to York School District One regarding the Jefferson High School Historical Marker. The marker and presentation was supported by the Jefferson Remembered Alumni group. The school board unanimously approved the installation for the marker at the original Rosenwald School site. We are currently drafting the marker text and it will be reviewed by the SC Historical Marker Program next month. A proposed draft will be provided after the review.
- ABS Kids Sponsorship for MSCM
 - The MSCM has been sponsored by ABS Kids with \$5,000 to facilitate sensory inclusive events for families with children who have Autism Spectrum Disorder. The MSCM is planning six events throughout the year, the first occurring on July 9th from 5-7pm.
- Construction of New Pig Pen at HB
 - The pigs at Historic Brattonsville have received a new, period-appropriate pen. Joe Mester, assisted by the HB Operations Department, have constructed a new pen, based upon traditional Carolina Piedmont, Upland South styles, documented through the Historic American Building Survey.

Past Events

Fascinating Forests Family Day (MYCO) Held on June 1, this event kicked off our summer programming, highlighting forests, snails, mushrooms, and fungi in alignment with our Summer 2024 exhibitions. Attendance was 183.

York School District 1 Summer Enrichment Program Partnership (MYCO) From June 10-13, the Museum of York County hosted a grant-funded program aimed at improving reading scores through a combination of school-based enrichment and museum visits. The program served 23 children.

DIY with Dad (MSCM) On June 15, dads and kids collaborated to build birdhouses in what was a very popular workshop, which sold out with a total of 48 participants.

Living History Saturday: A Celebration of the Senses (HB) "A Celebration of the Senses – Traditional Arts" highlights the craftsmanship of African-descended individuals from the Brattonsville community and the broader Carolina Piedmont. Featuring barn-loom weaving, natural dyeing with indigo, woodworking, cooking, herbal medicine, storytelling, call and response music, and blacksmithing. The event focused on visual, olfactory, and auditory experiences. Attendance for the first two Saturdays in June was 98.

Living History Saturday: Juneteenth (HB) On June 15, the annual Juneteenth celebration at Historic Brattonsville commemorated the abolition of slavery in the United States and its relevance to the Brattonsville community. The event featured living history interpreters and volunteers who demonstrated African-influenced foodways, art forms, and natural dyeing techniques. Participants engaged in hands-on activities, creating booklets for recipes, historical information, and Juneteenth artifacts. The event attracted 62 attendees.

Upcoming Events

Messy Maestros (MSCM) Messy Maestros, a summer art program at MSCM, takes place on Thursdays in June, July, and August. Each week, guests create projects aligned with the monthly theme. The program's first two weeks saw over 75 participants per session.

Hill's Ironworks Historical Marker (HC) The historical marker for Hill's Ironworks was damaged and has been replaced with a new one at Allison Creek Park, a safer location closer to the original Ironworks site. Conversations with York County Parks and Recreation about a marker re-dedication ceremony during the park's grand opening were unsuccessful, so the event is scheduled for July 12 at 2pm, the Friday before Huck's Defeat. This date avoids conflict with Juneteenth celebrations and honors the anniversary of the Ironworks' destruction by the British on June 16, 1780.

Battle of Huck's Defeat (HB) The annual reenactment of the Battle of Huck's Defeat, the 1780 conflict between local Patriot militia and Loyalist troops led by Captain Christian Huck, will take place on July 13 and 14 at Historic Brattonsville. Additional activities include live cavalry and musket-firing demonstrations, 18th century life demonstrations by military reenactors, children's militia drills, games, and educational activities. Tours of the Bratton family homes and Huck's Defeat Battlefield will also be conducted. A special presentation titled "A Black Loyalist's Liberty: How Lucy Banbury Took Back Her Freedom" will be held at noon on both days, presented by Carin Bloom of Middleton Place in Charleston.

World Snake Day (MYCO) On July 20, the Museum of York County will host World Snake Day. The event will celebrate snakes, highlighting their fascinating qualities and the importance of their conservation. Attendees can engage in snake-themed activities, craft their own snake models, and meet live snakes.

Fish with Teeth Camp (MYCO) From July 23 to July 26, the Museum of York County will hold the Fish with Teeth Camp. This week-long camp will focus on deep-sea creatures, featuring daily games, activities, and crafts. Participants will learn about sharks, jellyfish, sea mammals, and other marine life.

Wake Up Sleepyhead (MSCM) On July 27, the Main Street Children's Museum will celebrate National Sleepyhead Day. The event will include reading bedtime stories, counting sheep, and learning lullabies, creating a relaxed and cozy environment for all attendees.

CHM Project Updates

Ice Age Hall (MYCO) Enpuricon Inc. is scheduled to commence mold remediation work on June 24, 2024, with an estimated duration of one week. Following this, Valente Painting and Drywall will begin installing drywall on July 2, between 9:00 and 9:30am, expected to complete within a week. Kenny Color Lab plans to install the mural on July 22, allowing ample time for primer curing. Throughout these activities, the hall will remain closed to the public.

Col. Bratton Preservation Project (HB) Midwest Maintenance, Inc. (MMI) has requested a 30-day extension until July 12 for their work, focusing on installing gutters and downspouts on the east elevation of the Seminary in upcoming weeks. Sara Johnson, preservation volunteers, and CHM's summer intern, Dani Michelson, have completed the removal of failed skim coat and inappropriate patches from plaster walls in the Seminary. During this phase, deteriorated logs in the wall between the main room and the south addition were discovered, prompting consultation with Matteo Ferran Structural Engineers for next steps.

Homestead House Preservation Project (HB) Midwest Maintenance, Inc. (MMI) has requested a 30-day extension until Friday, July 12, from the original deadline of June 12. MMI's roofing subcontractor has completed the installation of built-in gutters and metal roofing panels on the Homestead House. However, gutter installation is still pending for the Assembly Hall. Currently, MMI is focused on completing paint touch-ups on the built-in gutters and metal roofing panels.

Fluid Preservation Room (MYCO) Catalyst Construction has obtained a building permit from the City of Rock Hill and aims to initiate the project on June 24. Coordination with Ice Age Hall remediation efforts will be essential.

Lowry Family Theatre Repair Project (McC) MMI submitted hard copies of drawings for permit review to the City of York on April 5 regarding the McCelvey Auditorium (Lowry Family Theatre). However, due to an initial misplacement, the City had not initiated the review process by June 6. Subsequently, digital copies of the drawings and specifications have been provided to the City.

During a recent site visit, the deputy fire chief advised MMI that alternative fire protection measures are necessary while the auditorium's sprinklers are temporarily disabled. Options discussed include implementing a 24/7 fire watch or installing temporary sprinklers. Following a meeting on June 6, it was suggested that the masonry wall between the auditorium and the main building could serve as a firewall if it meets the required fire rating. Temporary door fillings were proposed during repairs to achieve this measure. MMI has requested clarification from the City regarding the necessary fire rating but has not yet received a response. To date, MMI has completed the following tasks:

- Installed site protection and removed theater seats to facilitate shoring tower placement.
- Submitted submittals and shoring drawings, with the Building Plans Examiner providing a third round of comments on the shoring drawings.
- Developed templates for custom metal plates at truss connections, pending review by the Building Plans Examiner.
- Removed curtains and stage lighting in preparation for upcoming work.

Watt Cemetery (HB) In early June, John Fisher marked graves in Grid 1 in two days, supported by Bratton descendent Nancy Holmes, who assisted with mapping. Progress was temporarily interrupted by a technical problem in Grid 7, though initial mapping there has been completed and anomalies have been examined. Fisher plans to return later in June for detailed GPR scans in Grid 7. Meanwhile, efforts continue to finalize the map for Grid 1, where the number of graves surpasses initial projections. The final report is scheduled for submission by October 31st.

- **Security Cameras:** All cameras are installed and operational. Alarms and notifications are set up and functioning. IT is evaluating signal strength and solar recharge capabilities for one camera.
- **Fence:** Perimeter fencing around the cemetery is installed. Additional 184 feet of aluminum fence will be installed to balance the south side of the entrance during the week of June 24.
- **Markers:** CHM Exhibits has fabricated approximately 435 Corten Steel markers, including T-post extensions. Additional steel may be needed based on final marker count.
- **Parking Area:** we await confirmation from the County regarding assistance with road installation in November.

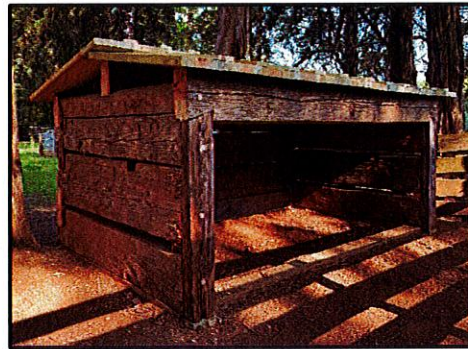
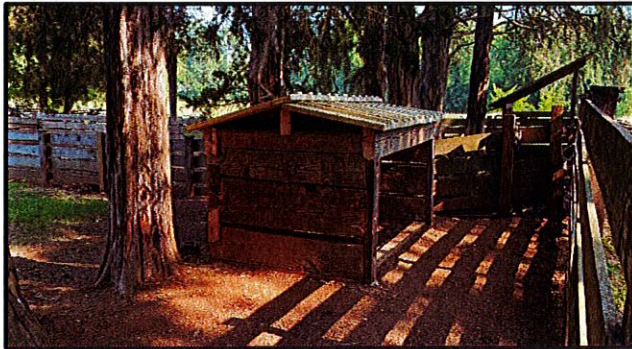
Shake Roof Replacement for Work Barn, Original Outbuilding, & Original Smoke House (HB)

The project has been contracted to Benton Roofing by CHM. The shakes are currently being manufactured, with installation scheduled to commence in mid-July, following Huck's Defeat.

Jefferson High School Historical Marker Update: CHM Historian Zach Lemhouse, and Nancy Sambets, Director of Archives, presented at the York School District One board meeting on June 11 regarding the Jefferson High School Historical Marker. The presentation was supported by members of the Jefferson Remembered Alumni group. The school board unanimously approved the installation of the historical marker at the original Rosenwald School site near Spruce Street and Pinkney Street. Currently, our team is drafting the marker text. Edwin Breeden, Director of the SC Historical Marker Program, will review our submission and provide a proposed draft by early next month.

ABS Kids Sponsorship for MSCM: ABS Kids has sponsored MSCM with \$5,000 to facilitate sensory inclusive events for FY '24 - '25. MSCM plans to organize six events, with the first scheduled for July 9, from 5-7 pm. ABS Kids specializes in serving families with children who have Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), offering diagnosis, personalized planning, one-on-one treatment, and community integration support.

Construction of New Pig Pen at HB: A new period-appropriate pig pen was completed on June 14. Brattonsville Operations oversaw the collection and transportation of salvaged logs to the construction site. Joe Mester led the construction, inspired by traditional Upland South styles, particularly those of the Carolina Piedmont, documented through the Historic American Building Survey.

John Spratt Jr.(1942-) was born in Charlotte, NC and raised in York, SC. He attended York High School. He earned his Master's degree in politics, philosophy, and economics from Oxford University in 1966 and a Bachelor of Law from Yale in 1969. He served as Army captain from 1969-1971 at the Pentagon. In 1971 he practiced law at the firm of Spratt, McKeown and Spratt. He was county attorney, school board attorney, and president of the Bank of Fort Mill. He served as a member of the House of Representatives starting in 1982 and was re-elected 13 times, serving until 2010. During his time in Congress he was on the Committee on Armed Services and was the chairman on the Committee on the Budget.

John Spratt Jr. is a descendant of the Brattons through his mother, Jane Love Bratton Spratt (1913-1980). Jane was the great, great-granddaughter of Col. William Bratton, making John a 3x great-grandson of Col. William Bratton. Jane's father was Rufus Andral Bratton (1859-1942) who was the son of James Rufus Bratton (1821-1897) and Mary Rebecca Massey (1831-1921). James Rufus Bratton was the son of John Simpson Bratton Sr. (1789-1843) and Harriet Rainey (1795-1874). John S. Bratton was the son of Col. William Bratton and Martha Robinson (1749-1816).

Description of Object(s) & Condition: Collection of almost 300 natural history books related to big game hunting and collection of documents related to the Shikar-Safari Club International's including meeting minutes, membership applications, correspondence, legal papers, and financial statements.

Method of Acquisition: The collection was loaned to Children's Nature Museum (now MYCO) as a permanent loan in September 1981. In 1990, the Stans Foundation and three of Maurice Stans friends purchased the collection from Shikar-Safari club and officially donated the research/reference library collection to MYCO.

Legal Status

Appropriate museum staff has consulted to ascertain whether there are any legal restrictions that would limit CHM's right to deaccession and dispose of the object(s).

Restrictions: Access to the collection is limited to staff, volunteers, Shikar-Safari Club members, and researchers who are vetted by museum staff.

Justification

Specific reasons for recommending the deaccession of the object(s): The Shikar-Safari Club library is not related to CHM's mission of focusing on the cultural and natural histories of the Carolina Piedmont with a majority of the books being related to African big game hunting.

Does it complement another collection? Yes. The Stans' African Collection, which CHM has been actively deaccessioning and transferring due to lack of mission relevance.

Value:

Current estimated value and determining source: Current value is unknown. In 1974, part of the collection was appraised at \$3,000. In 1981, another part of the collection was appraised at \$3850. There is significant historical value in these books given their early publication dates.

Proposed Disposition:

Transfer to: Transfer to another natural history institution that has a large African collection. Given the number of African specimens still waiting to be transferred out of CHM's collection, due to their lack of mission relevance, staff will see if the Shikar-Safari Library Collection could be bundled up with a specimen transfer. Possible institutions that staff could reach out to include: Clemson University and Anniston Museums.
